Non-Emergency Patient Transport Service in the North Hampshire Area

During 2016 the Ambulance Service will become the provider for journeys from treatment centres managed by Hampshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (HHFT). This covers North Hampshire Hospital in Basingstoke, Royal Hampshire County Hospital in Winchester and the Andover War Memorial Hospital.

These include the following journeys:

- To a planned outpatient appointment
- To hospital for a planned admission
- Home from hospital following patient discharge
- To and from renal dialysis appointments
- Home to Hampshire from hospitals in other areas of the country

What's Changing In 2016?

The transfer of services to the Ambulance Service will happen on the following dates:

- March 1 2016 for the North Hampshire Hospital in Basingstoke
- August 1 2016 for the Royal Hampshire County Hospital in Winchester and the Andover War Memorial Hospital.

Warning from Hampshire Trading Standards Service Blue Badge Parking

Trading Standards are would like to bring the public's attention to websites offering Blue Badge parking applications online, and charging a fee of £49. The websites are not affiliated or associated with any local council, or any other official body or organisation.

It is not obvious from entering the websites that they are not official, or that an application fee is charged. However, the information is contained in the terms and conditions, and it is recommended that these are looked at before deciding whether to use the sites.

It is possible to apply for a Blue Badge online through the official website <https://www.gov.uk/apply-blue-badge> or via Hampshire County Council's website <http://www3.hants.gov.uk/bluebadge/treasurers-bluebadgeapply.htm>

There is a fee of £10 per application, but no other charges.

POLICE UPDATE

Dear Residents

I am currently investigating several incidents within the area of this magazine. Overnight of January 28th/29th 2016 a set of car registration plates were stolen from a car in Old School Road, Newnham another set were taken off but discarded by the thieves. Again in Newnham, I am also investigating an incident in which a group of youths in a small grey car was seen at the old shed at Beehive Farm, in Tylney Lane at about 3pm on Wednesday February 3rd 2016, where damage was caused to the building. I am also investigating a theft of a black boxing punch bag from the rear garden of a house, near the Pond in Tunworth Road, Mapledurwell between February 17th/18th. If you can assist with any information concerning sightings of anything/anyone/vehicle acting suspiciously in any of these areas at the relevant times, please give me a call direct and as always all calls treated in strictest confidence.

As promised below for the Parishes covered by this magazine, the yearly reported crime figures for 2015 compared with those of 2014. Whilst Hampshire Constabulary and indeed other Police Forces have changed the way of recording crime which may have affected some of these statistics, we must also be aware that these crimes did take place. The figures below are ONLY those deemed by the Home Office as a crime, as such drink driving, traffic offences, poaching, speeding etc are deemed as Summary Offences and not included in these statistics.

For each Parish I have included the 2014 figure and the 2015 figure and below have provided a brief breakdown of what those crimes were.

Andwell: 2014=1 crime ~ 2015=3 crimes

Breakdown: Non Dwelling Burglary (1) attempted break-in to a garage in Andwell Lane. Theft (1) a fish trap from the river, and a criminal damage (1) to a parked stationary car also in Andwell Lane.

Mapledurwell: 2014=16 crimes ~ 2015=15 crimes

Breakdown: Non Dwelling Burglary (5) consisting at garages x 2, sheds x 2 and a communal area in a block of flats x 1. Assaults (4), Criminal Damage (2), Other Crime (Harassment) (1), Theft (1), Possession of Drugs (2)

Nately Scores: 2014=8 crimes ~ 2015=12 crimes

Breakdown: Thefts (4) including a safe and a ring plus leaving the Hotel without payment, Assaults (6) several were domestic related, Theft from Motor Vehicle (1) Possession of illegal drugs (1)

Newnham: 2014=10 crimes ~ 2015=11 crimes

Breakdown: Non Dwelling Burglary (3) business units x 2 and a metal container x 1. Criminal Damage (4), a grave, lock, gate and van, Assault (2) one was a dog related incident, Theft (1) fish poaching, Other Crimes (2)

Up Nately: 2014=3 crimes ~ 2015=2 crimes

Breakdown: Burglary Dwelling (1) several people arrested but insufficient evidence and a Non Dwelling burglary (1)

Overall across the twenty-two parishes that made up my pre April 2015, beat area, 120 crimes were reported in 2014, for the same area in 2015 this rose to 142. I am however pleased to report that the burglary of sheds and outbuildings etc fell from 28 in 2014 to 24 in 2015 and of theft offences fell from 21 cases in 2014 to 18 in 2015. However, sadly burglary of homes increased from 2 in 2014 to 3 in 2015 and in one several men from London have been arrested and charged. Criminal Damage also rose from 22 cases in 2014 to 31 in 2015 and again this is in part to poachers driving over and ruining growing crops.

Please rest assured that we live in a very safe area however if you have any concerns over these figures do let me know and I will explain them to you in more detail.

The 'strategic urban extension' of 800 houses proposed for Hart's Local Plan

Hart's Local Plan Consultation Re-started - Action Needed

Hart has relaunched its 'Refined Housing Options' and 'Vision and Strategic Priorities' Consultation abruptly pulled on 14th January one day ahead of the Consultation deadline. The updated documents are available at www.hart.gov.uk/consultations. Also see <http://hookdevaction.org.uk/>.

The new deadline is 4pm Friday 18th March.

The changes Hart felt required to make to avoid potential legal challenge make no material difference to the Consultation.

However, for all who previously responded, you will need to complete a form – www.hart.gov.uk/confirmation-local-plan-response – confirming you have read the amended documents and wish your response to be resubmitted to the new Consultation. There is no need to complete or re-type the whole response again.

Hart says 'We understand that not everybody has use of the internet. Yes, someone can submit on the respondent's behalf providing they have full permission from the respondent.' I had to make several trips to pick up all the donations. Our MU teams and their friends had to pack all day Wednesday and late into the evening on Thursday to be ready for the vans on Friday! On Friday 29th January they made it to Worthing with 1 transit van, 2 florist vans and 3 cars in time for the drop off time slot of 10am-2pm and watched our donations upload onto the enormous container lorry.

They were very impressed by the whole organisation. It was all quite exciting and everyone there was lovely. Within a fortnight there will be lots of love being unloaded to those living in the camps which will be so welcome there. Thank you again."

NEWS FROM ODIHAM COTTAGE HOSPITAL



New shop in Old Basing

Many of you have already discovered our latest venture at 42 Belle Vue Road. We opened the shop just in time for Christmas and have been really encouraged by the warm welcome, lovely donations and kind volunteers who have offered help. Volunteers and donations always needed and we now have space to take small items of furniture. But of course what we really need are CUSTOMERS, so please come and have a browse, pick up a bargain and meet Sue, our new manager. (Shop phone 01256 346624)

So what do we use this money for?

Now that the hospital no longer has inpatient beds, people may rightly ask "Why does Odiham Cottage Hospital still need money?"

Since the NHS withdrew inpatient care in 2011, the Trustees have worked hard to develop a range of health and social care services that are needed by local patients. Some of these are based in the hospital building and include a day centre for frail and elderly, lunch club for the active elderly, complementary therapy for those with end of life conditions and their carers and counselling services (which include those specifically designed to support young people, adults suffering from anxiety and depression or people with relationship problems)

Many other services are delivered in the community and include our volunteer befriending service and palliative care given by St Michael's Hospice at Home

All of these services are subsidised by Odiham Cottage Hospital and are delivered to patients and clients at a reduced or zero cost.

With increasing financial pressure on the NHS and Adult Services it is fortunate that, as a voluntary care service, we are able to fill some of the gaps for local people. We know from anecdotal evidence, how much this is valued by the clients and patients we serve.

None of this would be possible without your support. Thank you.

Dear Friends

Have you noticed that if someone comments on the date of Easter it always seems to be either 'awfully early this year' or 'terribly late'? Easter never seems to come at just the time that we think it should come! As you may have heard, if the Archbishop of Canterbury has his way, the date of Easter might soon be fixed and then we shall all know where we are and be able to plan our lives accordingly. Mind you, while some people think this is a very good idea, others are adamant that it should never be changed. We shall have to wait and see what happens!

I'm actually writing this letter to you in the very middle of February, our shortest month even with the addition of a leap year day this year. Easter is still several weeks away. Just last week our Daniel came for his Shrove Tuesday pancake feast and on Ash Wednesday our church service marked the beginning of Lent. This is an opportunity to turn away from all those things that lure us away from God and to give him a bit more time and attention. Our walk through Lent is underway and whether it is giving up chocolate or alcohol, making a real effort to be kinder and more thoughtful to one another and to the environment, or perhaps, like me, taking on some extra spiritual reading, there are lots of different ways we can use this time in preparation for Easter.
